### What do pharmacy technicians do?

Pharmacy technicians play a crucial role in keeping a pharmacy running smoothly. They have excellent communication skills and the best of the best genuinely understand what it means to offer service with a smile.

### Where do they work?

Pharmacy technicians work in a number of settings that range from standard pharmacies and drugstores to hospitals and grocery stores\* This variety provides pharm techs a lot more flexibility when working a schedule that fits their individual lifestyle.

### How much do they earn?

According to the U.S. Department of Labor, pharmacy technicians with formal training or national certification are in particularly high demand and often earn more than those without these qualifications. Specific pay rates vary by region, employer, and work setting; however, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reports that the median annual salary of professionals in the field is \$37,790.\*

### How's the job outlook?

Pharmacy technicians are in demand—in fact, job rates are expected to grow 6% over the next 10 years.\*
